## Background Information on What Stockport Local Authority does with pupils' and children's data

The **Local Authority (LA)** uses information about children for whom it provides services, to enable it to carry out specific functions for which it is responsible, such as the assessment of any special educational needs the child may have. It also uses the information to derive statistics to inform decisions on (for example) the funding of schools, and to assess the performance of schools and set targets for them. The statistics are used in such a way that individual children cannot be identified from them.

The Local Authority will use information about its school workforce for research and statistical purposes, and to evaluate and develop education policy and strategies. The statistics are used in such a way that individual staff cannot be indentified from them. **NHS Trusts** use information about pupils for research and statistical purposes, to monitor the performance of local health services and to evaluate and develop them. The statistics are used in such a way that individual pupils cannot be identified from them. In Stockport, this is the Stockport NHS Foundation Trust. Youth Support Services – Stockport Council's Services for Young People (SfYP) provides youth support services in Stockport and is designed to support children and young people who are not participating (or at risk of not participating) in learning. SfYP, as well as other areas of Stockport Council, work with children and young people aged 5 to 19 (25 for young people with disabilities). Pupil information will be used by SfYP and key partners to ensure we are able to provide the best service possible to young people.

For young people aged 13 or over, we are required by law to pass on certain information to SfYP. We must provide the names and addresses of you and your parent(s) (and your date of birth) and any further information relevant to the support services' role. However, until you are aged 16 or older, your parent(s) can ask that no information beyond your name, address and date of birth (and their name and address) be passed on to SfYP. This right transfers to you on your 16th birthday. Please inform your school if this is what you or your parents wish.
