Change to timings of the school day
Dear parents and carers
I am writing to you to inform you of an important change to the timings of the school day from September 2023. During the Covid pandemic, the Department for Education announced that from September 2023 the minimum amount of time that a student spends in school each week, including breaks and lunchtime, should be at least 32.5 hours. At present, the MHS week is shorter than the new expected minimum by over two hours.

Whilst we do not agree that up to now MHS students have been disadvantaged by the current school timings, a fact supported by the very strong academic outcomes achieved by students in the summer of 2022, we support the move to a longer school week. On the rear of this letter is a diagram showing the new timings of the school day. The key differences are as follows:

| End time (Tues-Fri) | 2.50 pm | 3.10 pm |
| End of the shorter after-school sanction (Tues-Fri) | 3.20 pm | 3.30 pm |
| End of the longer after-school sanction (Tues-Fri) | 3.50 pm | 3.50 pm |
| Start time (Monday) | 8.35 am | 8.30 am |
| Student end time (Monday) | 2.00 pm | 2.25 pm |
| End of the shorter after-school sanction (Monday) | 2.30 pm | 2.45 pm |
| End of the longer after-school sanction (Monday) | 3.00 pm | 3.05 pm |

## Other changes include:

- Whilst the majority of lessons will remain at 60 minutes in length, 8 lessons per week will extend to 65 minutes
- There will no longer be any 50 minute lessons, and instead the shortest lessons (on a Monday) will now be 55 minutes.
- The timings of Tues-Fri will be uniform, which is simpler than the current model where Thursday has different timings within the school day.
- Lunchtime will be 5 minutes longer per day
- Overall, students will spend 15 minutes more with their form tutor per week, and 90 minutes more in lessons per week.
- We are keeping an earlier finish for students on a Monday in order to facilitate extra training for staff each week. This extra training has been instrumental in improving standards at our school over the past four years which is why we are keeping it.
- Bus companies have been informed and we will communicate new bus information when we receive it.

The change of the school day timings has been approved by the Governing body and will come into effect from September 2023.
